
ALL ROADS LEAD TO MORGES

ANGLOPHILES FROM ALL over Europe gathered in Morges for the Swiss Classic British Meeting, which drew more than 1500 cars and motorcycles to the lakeside town on 2 October. Anniversaries being celebrated included the 111th year of Riley, with a fascinating array of the diamond marque taking pride of place in the château

grounds. The star of the group was a Rallye des Alpes-winning Brooklands. Later models featured, too, such as a mint Pathfinder and several Elfs from the BMC era.

Nearby, the ornamental recreation park – normally known as the Parc de l'Independence – was renamed Le Parc de Triumph for the day to mark 80 years since the

formation of the Triumph Motor Company. Pick of the exceptional restored vehicles was a Le Mansentrant TRS sporting the famous 'Sabrina' engine. Other rarities included an Arnolt-MG and a delicious Touring-bodied Alvis.

The event was first held in 1992, at Signal de Bougy. As co-organiser Keith Wynn put it: "By placing a

small advert in *La Vie de l'Auto*, Mary and I were delighted to attract nearly 200 cars, despite – or maybe because of! – some authentic British-style fog and rain."

The meeting rapidly outgrew the venue and soon snowballed to its current size in Morges. The 2011 20th-anniversary meet is on 1 October: see www.british-cars.ch
